Each summer a four-day annual meeting is held that includes field trips, workshops and the opportunity to share information with other members from all over the country. The meeting is held in a different location each year.

Black Walnut (scientific name *Juglans nigra*) is the primary walnut species managed in the United States. It is widely considered to be the most beautiful, useful and valuable of our native hardwoods. When located on suitable soils and properly managed, black walnut can grow rapidly, providing a profitable investment while improving our environment.



The Walnut Council was created in 1970 to serve walnut growers, and the firms and individuals who make and use walnut lumber, veneer, nuts, and other products. It is a non-profit organization made up primarily of landowners, foresters, researchers, and wood industry people from around the world who are interested in the planting, management and use of black walnut and other fine hardwoods.

MARYLAND CHAPTER
